Another state university vice-chancellor said the governor can refuse to sign the bill once but if the state government sends it back, he is bound to sign it. In 2019, the state government had introduced rules allowing a university to hold its senate meeting without the governor's nod.

The West Bengal College and University Teachers' Association asked why the state government had not explored the option of nominating an eminent scholar or educationist as chancellor, a possibility Basu had himself spoken about in December.

Basu had posted a tweet on December 24 saying: "It is high time to introspect whether we should continue with the colonial legacy of the governor being the chancellor of universities just by the virtue of his post or we should nominate eminent scholars and educationists as chancellors."

A former VC said: "This government has since coming to power made tall claims about depoliticising the campuses. If they were sincere, an academic should have been nominated as chancellor. Instead, they decided to establish a government stranglehold over the universities."

Many teachers felt the decision is a blow to academic autonomy, a charge also levelled in the past against the present Bengal governor.

Jadavpur University had held its annual convocation on December 24, 2019, without the chancellor, who was blockaded by students on a campus replete with "Not Our Chancellor" posters.

Basu had earlier expressed the government's displeasure at the chancellor allegedly sitting on files on the reappointment of VCs.

Some teachers wondered whether the state government's move might affect the flow of funds from the University Grants Commission.

A pro-VC of a state-run university said the governor had been made the ex-officio chancellor so that he could hear the grievances if any differences arose between the state government and university teachers and officials.

Jab tribute to freedom struggle

Calcutta: The state government will start a special drive to vaccinate against Covid-19 all residents of three Bengal districts chosen by the Centre — East Burdwan, and East and West Midnapores — with due second and precautionary (booster) doses from next week for three months.

Officials said East Burdwan and twin Midnapores in Bengal were chosen in the first phase of the Centre's programme to celebrate 75 years of Indian Independence as these districts had made significant contributions during the freedom struggle.

Freedom fighters Batukeshwar Dutt and Rash Behari Bose hailed from East Burdwan. East and West Midnapore — then undivided — were homes to freedom fighters Kshudiram Bose and Matangini Hazra.

"We will send specific orders to the three districts very soon. They have been given a specific target of vaccination. There are around seven lakh people whose second dose is due in these three districts. East Burdwan alone has four lakh people who need to get the second dose. Those whose precautionary dose is due will also be vaccinated under this special drive," said a senior health official in Calcutta.

In Bengal, around 7.29 crore and 6.42 crore people have been vaccinated with first and second doses, respectively. Only 29.11 lakh have received the booster so far.

Officials said that during the special drive in East Burdwan and twin Midnapores, they had been asked to increase the number of vaccination camps and visit the doorsteps of those whose second and

precautionary dose were due. Officials need to complete the task within three months and submit a report to the state.

Sources in the state government said that in April this year, the Centre had started an initiative to complete vaccination in the districts that had played a significant role in the freedom struggle. "For Bengal, the Centre chose these three districts as many freedom fighters hail from these pockets," said a health official.

Sources said that after the special drive in these three districts, the health department would focus on areas where vaccination was "slow".

Chief minister Mamata Banerjee, who on May 10 held a review meeting with the state and district officials on Covid-19 in Bengal, also directed a few districts with comparatively low vaccination to increase the number of jabs as soon as possible.

On her May 18 visit to West Midnapore, Mamata had also stressed the contribution of undivided Midnapore in the country's freedom struggle.

"We can't forget the role of Midnapore in the freedom struggle of India. Three places in the country — Satara in Maharashtra, Ballia in UP and Tamralipta (part of undivided Midnapore and where the Tamralipta National Government was formed in 1942) — played a key role in the movement against the British," she had said.

40 Covid cases

Bengal on Thursday reported 40 new Covid-19 infections, 37 recoveries and no death.

Currently, the state has 361 active cases, according to the state bulletin. The state's positive confirmation rate was 0.48 per cent, recovery rate 98.93 per cent and mortality rate 1.05 per cent on Thursday.

Siliguri rural polls on June 26

Calcutta/Siliguri: The State Election Commission on Thursday announced it would hold polls to the Siliguri Mahakuma Parishad and six civic wards on June 26, the day fixed by the government for voting at the Gorkhaland Territorial Administration Sabha.

State election commissioner Sourav Das said in Calcutta that the notifications for the SMP and the civic polls would be issued on Friday.

At least 22 gram panchayats with 462 seats, four panchayat samitis with 66 seats and one mahakuma parishad with nine seats shall go to the polls in Siliguri. Elections will also be held in ward 8 of Panihati, ward 2 of Jhalda, ward 29 of South Dum Dum, ward 4 of Dum Dum, ward 3 of Bhatpara and ward 17 of Chandernagore.

Das said EVMs would be used for the polls.

Over five lakh people in the rural areas of the Siliguri subdivision are eligible to cast votes for the three-tier panchayat elections of the SMP.

Darjeeling district magistrate S. Ponnambalam said the filing of nominations for the SMP polls would begin on Friday. "The filing of nominations will continue till June 2, followed by a scrutiny of papers on June 4. The last date of withdrawal is June 7. The date of counting would be announced in due course," said the DM.



Sayantika Das, the eight-year-old girl from Malda, who wanted to meet chief minister Mamata Banerjee and thank her for introducing welfare schemes for students of Bengal, especially girls, got her wish in Calcutta on Thursday.

The Class II student had planned to cycle some 350km from Malda to Calcutta to meet Mamata. On learning this, Mamata had instructed the Malda district administration to ask Sayantika to go by train, keeping in mind the risk of cycling on highways at her tender age.

Helped by the administration, the girl and her parents took Saraighat Express from Malda on Wednesday night. She also carried her cycle. On Thursday, they reached Howrah and were escorted to a resthouse by police personnel.

Then, Sayantika cycled to the chief minister's modest residence at Harish Chatterjee Road, which took her 20 minutes. Her parents reached Mamata's residence separately.

Sayantika later said that Mamata had been very warm, arranged breakfast for them and accepted the aamras (mango candy) and mango sapling that she had brought as gifts from Malda. "She encouraged me to continue with my studies," Sayantika said, adding that she received books, chocolates and dolls from the chief minister.

Mamata also shared pictures of this interaction on Twitter. "Pride of Bengal!" she tweeted, adding how Sayantika and her sisters "benefitted from several GoWB flagship schemes like Kanyashree and Sabooj Sathi".

Query to CJI on NRC boss

Guwahati: A civil society group opposed to the Citizenship Amendment Act has written to the Chief Justice of India asking whether incumbent NRC Assam coordinator Hitesh Dev Sarma had the Supreme Court's permission to question the accuracy of the register and file a criminal case against his predecessor Prateek Hajela.

In a letter to CJI N.V. Ramana on May 24, Coordination Committee Against Citizenship Amendment Act chairman Hiren Gohain and chief coordinator Deben Tamuly said that since the Supreme Court had "monitored the entire process" of preparing the NRC in Assam with a view to ensuring its integrity and impartiality, and approved its final draft, it was "assumed by all responsible quarters that it was a reasonably correct document and that it had its bonafides beyond all doubt".

But Sarma, the one-page letter said, "has from day one questioned the accuracy and validity of the document and made wild charges about millions of foreigners fraudulently making their way into its rolls".

Sarma, who replaced Hajela in November 2019, has accused Hajela and others of manipulating data entry and avoiding quality check and verification to facilitate the inclusion of ineligible persons in the register, which is a document of Indian citizens.

The letter also referred to Sarma's recent FIR against Hajela before the Assam police CID accusing him of "corrupt and biased management of the process leading to entry of millions of foreigners" in the NRC.

"He also produced some alleged proof of the charges on the basis of some sample survey. He has received support from various biased and fanatical circles and put in grave alarm millions of genuine citizens who had incurred high expenses and undergone the rigours and the pain of the exercise to prove their citizenship. This also tends to arouse anxieties among saner sections of the public who thought the turmoil and unrest over this fraught question had been brought to an end by the completion of the NRC," the letter said.

The updated 1951 NRC, published on August 31, 2019, had excluded 19,06,657 of the 3,30,27,661 applicants with several organisations, including the Assam Public Workers, and the BJP-led state government expressing concern over suspected illegal migrants allegedly getting their names included in the register.

The letter further said that the civil society group "therefore would most humbly implore you to clarify whether the present coordinator had your permission for what appears to us to be an outrage against recent legitimate norms of public life..."

Ropeway in limbo for want of cash

Siliguri: A 2.5km-long ropeway service planned eight years back between Rohini, around 25km from here, and Giddapahar on the outskirts of Kurseong, is not yet complete owing to a cash crunch.

The project, taken up by Conveyor and Ropeway Services Private Limited and funded by the Gorkhaland Territorial Administration (GTA), started in August 2014 with an 18-month deadline.

"We stopped construction work of the ropeway service from Kurseong to Rohini for the past one-and-a-half years as the GTA is yet to clear a portion of the dues. If the dues are cleared, we will resume work

and we hope to finish the project in four months," said Prabh Gupta, project director of the ropeway service.

On August 28, 2014, work on the passenger ropeway service, which was expected to

draw more tourists to the hills and cut travel time between the plains and hills, started with an estimated cost of Rs 16 crore.

According to Gupta, out of 16 towers to be built along the

route of the ropeway, 15 have been put up.

"Installation of only one tower and the control panel is yet to be carried out, plus some minor work. It is because of fund constraints that we were forced to stop work," he added.

Sources in the GTA admitted that they were yet to make the final payment to the firm.

Around Rs 5.93 crore is to be paid, which includes GST, they said.

The GTA lacks adequate funds right now to make the payment, a source said. "We have written to the state government, seeking approval of funds and hope that once the GTA elections are over, funds will be available for the project," the source added.

'Sorry' jibe from Dilip

Calcutta: BJP national vice-president Dilip Ghosh on Thursday "apologised" to all those who felt happy at the possibility of him moving out of Bengal and said he was "not going anywhere".

A section of BJP leaders in Bengal, who are opposed to Ghosh, felt "relieved" and assumed that the Midnapore MP had been plucked out of the state with the central leadership assigning him the task of strengthening booth-level organisations in seven states and a Union territory.

Putting to rest all such speculations, Ghosh told **The Telegraph**: "Initially, I might

need to go there a couple of times but the job will be done mostly over phone and virtually."

"Updates and reports from these states can be monitored through an application. I don't need to stay there," he added, rejecting rumours that he would have to spend months travelling in his assigned territories.

Ghosh's tenure as the Bengal BJP chief was cut short in September last year. He was replaced by Balurghat MP Sukanta Majumdar. The two have rarely been on the same page. Ghosh has differences with the state general secretary (organisation), Amitava Chakraborty, and Opposition leader Suwendu Adhikari as well.

As the news of Ghosh's purported removal from Bengal reached the state unit, a section of functionaries known for the proximity to the current leadership said they were happy. These people said Ghosh's remarks and interference had often hindered the smooth functioning of the new committee and hence, it was "good that he has been removed".

On Thursday, Ghosh in a tongue-and-cheek retort said: "Sorry, I can't make them happy. I'm not going anywhere."

Ghosh said he would concentrate on his Lok Sabha constituency Midnapore, but would be available if the state unit wanted to use him. "Why will I go anywhere?"
